NEW TRIALS

Phase 1 Study of 131-1 mlBG, Nivolumab and ch14.18/CHO in relapsed/refractory neuroblastoma (MINIVAN)

Band of Parents has partnered with several like-minded nonprofit charities in funding a new trial of combination immunotherapy with targeted radiotherapy in children with neuroblastoma. Since more than 50% of children with high-risk neuroblastoma relapse after standard treatment, the hope is that this new regimen, if effective, would be integrated into frontline therapy in clinic. Researchers expect patients to tolerate the new combination therapy well enough that it could be delivered mostly on an outpatient basis. Thirty-six patients at four hospitals in the U.K., U.S., and Germany will be enrolled in the trial – the first-ever such combination therapy. OTHER TRIAL HIGHLIGHTS

Next Generation Personalized Neuroblastoma Therapy for Neuroblastoma (NEPENTHE), Children's Hospital of Philadelphia

The Board of Directors received an on-site update from Dr. John S. Maris and Dr. Yael P. Mosse of the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP) on this ambitious Phase 1 study of innovative combination drug therapies for improving high-risk neuroblastoma survival. The trial matches genomic aberrations in neuroblastoma cells at the time of relapse to special combinations of molecularly targeted agents that have shown success in preclinical models. The team biopsies tumors in eligible patients with relapsed or primary refractory neuroblastoma. Tumor DNA and RNA are processed to identify protocol-specified biomarkers for targeted therapy. Twenty-four patients have been enrolled in the trial since August 2016. After the medical briefing, the board toured CHOP's neuroblastoma laboratory, and the state-of-the art Buerger Center for outpatient care. (CHOP, Drs. John Maris and Yael Mosse)

New Approaches to Neuroblastoma Therapy Consortium, (NANT), Children's Hospital of Los Angeles



Band of Parents Chairman Mark Winthrop and I were briefed by the NANT team at CHLA – which is the operations center for this wide-ranging trial that includes 18 children's cancer centers across North America, Europe and Australia. As we reported in our last BandWith newsletter, we are co-funding a NANT trial of the promising lung cancer drug Lorlatinib, for use in children with ALK-driven neuroblastoma. The first patient has since been enrolled in this breakthrough trial. (CHLA, Drs. Araz Marachelian, Robert C. Seeger, Shahab Asgharzadeh)
